



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On March 1st, the season of LENT begins. We begin Lent with an Ash Wednesday worship service at 7:00pm. I encourage people of all ages to attend. I will intentionally have a time to speak to the children about what we are preparing to do as we begin LENT. And what exactly are we preparing to do? Thomas A 'Kempis captures the intent in the following excerpt taken from his book, *The Imitation of Christ*.

“What good is it to live long when we improve so little? A long life does not always improve us; in fact, it often adds to our problems. Would that we could spend even one day well in this world. Many people count the years of their lives in Christ, but often not much comes of their attempts to change their lives. If it is frightful to die, perhaps it is more dangerous still to live a long life.

Blessed is that person who always has the hour of death before his eyes and who is daily prepared to die!... Always be ready, therefore, and live so that death my never find you unprepared... How happy and wise is that person who strives now to be in life what he wishes to be found in death... Keep yourself as a pilgrim and stranger on earth, a person to whom the affairs of the world mean nothing apart from Christ.”

Through the ages, people have given up something for Lent as a way to grow in their relationship with God and their understanding of the Way of Jesus. Often the thing we gave up is taken up again after Easter. To move this idea in a different direction, what if we add something to our lives during Lent to heighten its spiritual significance for us? We are giving you some tools and opportunities to add something and hope you will take advantage of some of them. Bulletin insert with weekly scripture readings for prayer and reflection, fellowship meal and Bible study on Wednesday evening, and special services during Holy Week.

During Lent I invite you to examine yourself and to prepare for Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. Every year we have another opportunity to open ourselves to God's healing and grace-filled love and reaffirm our commitment to follow Jesus. It is God who brings the change and growth, but we also need to do our part. How is it with your soul as you head into LENT? Come and grow with us as we prepare our hearts and minds to deepen our walk as followers of our Lord, our Love, our Everything, Jesus Christ.

Sharing God's Bounty—March

The Name that Is Above Every Name

Obedience has become an almost ignored concept. Some parents believe that requiring obedience from their children stifles their creative and emotional development. Many couples remove the word “obey” from the vows that brides give to their grooms. To expect employees to obey their employers is certainly not acceptable.

To God, however, obedience is not only acceptable, it is required. Disobedience to God is what is known as sin. And sin separates. Sin separates us from God and from each other. Sin prevents us from living the abundant life that Christ came to give us (John 10:10). On the other hand, obedience is proof of love: “*If you love me, you will obey what I command,*” Jesus says (John 14:15).

Unfortunately, as sinful beings, we are unable to obey our Lord's commands fully. Even the great apostle Paul struggled with this reality. He confessed, “*I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out*” (Romans 7:18). As he relates his dilemma – the dilemma all Christians face – he asks, “*Who will rescue me from this body of death?*” (For as surely as day follows night, death follows disobedience) He answers exultantly, “*Thanks be to God – through Jesus Christ our Lord!*” (Romans 7:24-25)

Jesus has lived the perfect life in our place. Jesus willingly emptied himself, made himself nothing, “*and became obedient to death – even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name*” (Philippians 2:7-9).

Jesus did what we cannot do. Jesus triumphed over sin, death, and the devil. Jesus, dead and buried, would not stay there! Jesus has risen! He is exalted to the highest place! He has given us his Spirit, the Counselor, who lives with us and in us (John 14:16-17), to sanctify us for obedience to our Father and service to others. This Spirit equips and enables us to be faithful stewards of the Gospel and all his gifts. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Christian Stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities, and material possessions based on the conviction that these are a trust from God, to be used in God's service for the benefit of all mankind in grateful acknowledgement of Christ's redeeming love.

We enjoyed ourselves at the Trampoline Park on a subsequent meeting. Finally, our first swim night of the new year will happen at our last meeting. Swimming is a life skill ...the better you do, the more fun you'll have!

In February and March, new scouts will join our Troop. Look for all the new faces around our meetings. The first meeting of March will include a new scout orientation and new parent orientation. Also, we'll conduct an Order of the Arrow election. Our scouts will vote on their peers. (OA is the National Honor Society of campers in scouting.) Our second meeting of the month puts us back in the pool at Jefferson High School. The third meeting of March will be our Troop elections. The youth leadership of the Troop will pass their duties onto new scouts, who will spend the next 6-months getting the experience to be good leaders. That is a skill that is a primary function of a good Boy Scout troop. The March campout will be in MacQueen Forest Preserve, where we will have access to the lodge as well as tent camping. This outing is intended to help our younger scouts gain some of the basic skills they will use in scouting; and our older scouts will have opportunities to use their leadership skills to teach by using the EDGE method. The final meeting of the month starts the preparation for summer camp. Troop 181 has chosen to go to our local Camp Lowden this June-July. This will be an exciting time for the newer scouts to be away from home the first time, and our older scouts to exercise some freedom in a safe environment. All boys do some maturing during this week!

God bless you, John Osborn, and God bless the saints of CVUMC who took a young man under their wing!




