





Sharing God's Bounty—March

What Have I Done for Him?

Lent is a season in the church year during which we particularly focus on the sacrifice Jesus made for us to pay the debt we owed for our sin. We know there is no way we can pay the debt ourselves. Only the sinless Son of God could do that. We have access to heaven only by grace through faith in Christ Jesus.

While we cannot repay Jesus for what he has done for us, his love does require a response. Paul, speaking of our ministry of reconciliation, wrote, "For Christ's love compels us . . ." (2 Corinthians 5:14). We remain on earth to carry out the tasks which Christ left for us to do: to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the sick, and visit the prisoner, (Matthew 25:31-46). James admonished us that ". . . faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead" (James 2:17). We provide the funds that support our pastors, teachers, and missionaries. Again, we can quote Paul writing in 1 Corinthians 9:11-12. "If we have sown spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a material harvest from you? If others have this right of support from you, shouldn't we have it all the more?" Certainly each of us is addressed by the Great Commission: "Go and make disciples of all nations . . ." (Matthew 28:19). The following words from Frances Ridley Havergal are a poignant reminder that Christ's love and sacrifice for us require a response:

*Thy life was given for me,
Thy Blood, O Lord, was shed
That I might ransomed by,
and quickened from the dead.
Thy life was given for me,
What have I given for Thee?
And Thou hast brought to me
Down from Thy home above
Salvation full and free,
Thy pardon and Thy love.
Great gifts
Thou broughtest me,
What have I brought to Thee?*

We are saved by grace through faith for works. Let us pray for the desire to be good stewards of the gifts of salvation, health and wealth, and time and opportunity which God has given us that we might have a part in the furthering of God's kingdom.

We need not give up the pleasures and luxuries of this life. God does not call us to be ascetics, but he does call us to a right sense of proportion in administering our substance.

The question is: "If I have this for myself, then what should I do for God?" This is the question into which the whole matter of stewardship resolves itself.

Jason Brown: From the NFL to Farming**



In 2009, Jason Brown seemed to have it all—a successful NFL career, a lovely wife and a growing family. In fact, he had a five-year contract with the St. Louis Rams for \$37.5 million, at the time making him the highest-paid center in the NFL.

He felt God leading him to quit the NFL. And become a farmer. Walking away from his football career at age 29. So they purchased a 1,000-acre farm and moved to North Carolina.



They named their acreage First Fruits Farm because Jason and his wife Tay believed God was telling them to feed the hungry and use the farm to witness to others about Christ's love. Their first harvest was in 2014, and they donated 120,000 pounds of sweet potatoes and 10,000 pounds of cucumbers to food banks.

- John the Baptist even encourages his own disciples to follow Jesus (John 1:36).

JOIN US FOR A GROUP FAST DURING LENT 2018*

FASTING is abstaining from solid food or bypassing the opportunity to eat with a specific spiritual goal in mind.

How will it work? Each week in Lent, we will have one 24-hour period of fasting. We will begin on Monday at 8:00am and end Tuesday at 8:00am. You will want to make sure to eat breakfast before you begin the fast.

After 8:00am on Tuesday eat a light breakfast. If you cannot wait until after 8:00am on Tuesday to eat, then eat breakfast when you wake up.

First fast: February 19 Last fast: March 26

How do I prepare for fasting? Preparation is both mental and physical.

Mental Attitude. Be positive that God will use this time of fasting for your spiritual nurture.

Physical Attitude. As the temple of the Holy Spirit, we fast to cleanse our bodies and remind ourselves of the importance of a healthy body. Drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated.

Physical limitations. Fasting from solid food is not recommended for everyone. If you have any health concerns, talk to your doctor before fasting.

Why should I fast? Fasting is one of many spiritual disciplines ordained by God. The central idea in fasting is the voluntary denial of an otherwise normal function for the sake of intense spiritual activity.

It is good to have a goal for fasting. It helps us focus on why we are fasting. It is suggested that you select one goal for this period of Lent, write it down, and focus on it during your 24-hour fast. Below are some examples of goals for fasting as found in the Bible.

To humble ourselves before God. Psalm 35:13
King David wrote, "Yet when they were ill, I put on sackcloth and humbled myself with fasting."

To spend this time reading scripture. Jeremiah 36:3
"So you go to the house of the LORD on a day of fasting and read to the people from the scroll the words of the LORD that you wrote as I dictated."

To come closer to God. Joel 2:12
"Even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning."

To discern God's will. Acts 13:2
"While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

To intercede and pray on behalf of others. 1 Timothy 2:1
"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession, and thanksgiving be made for all people—"

**Note from Pastor Vickie*

1. *If you have never fasted before and would like to try this, please talk to me beforehand.*
2. *If you are going to participate, please let me know. Our group will pray for each other, encourage one another, and meet after Easter to debrief and share our experiences.*
