



## A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

*“But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream.*

*It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit.”*

**Jeremiah 17:7-8 (NIV)**

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

One of the many jobs that I had prior to ordination was as a city bus driver (a Huskie Bus) in DeKalb. I drove the bus as while still a college student and then as a college graduate trying to figure out what to do with a sociology degree. Even though the buses back then lacked air conditioning or even power steering, I enjoyed it. I enjoyed the rhythm. I enjoyed interacting with the passengers.

One recurrent interaction involved a sign displayed above the inside of the front window – “Driver wears a seat belt for your safety.” No other seats had safety belts. The oft asked question was how does the driver’s seat belt contribute to the passengers’ safety. I (and other drivers) would explain that in the event of a crash, the seat belt kept the driver in place to control the bus. If the driver were to be displaced, the bus could careen out of control leading to other collisions and injuries.

When I have house guests, I sometimes “joke” that I will have coffee in the morning for their safety. (I’m not a morning person.) Sometimes we need reminded that it’s not only okay, but essential for others that we take care of ourselves.

As we enter November and then December, many of us will feel the pull to yield to others expectations. Holiday invitations won’t be limited to Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If we don’t attend to our own needs, we can easily be swept up into expectations that drain us or fray our nerves. Often those expectations come from those closest to us. Those closest to us feel the same demands: competing invitations from parents and in-laws, children and friends. Celebrations may become obligations, stripping them of the very joy intended.

There’s an old saying, “You can please some of the people some of the time, but you can’t please all the people all the time.” I don’t know if it’s even possible to please all the people sometimes (or even one time.) Even Jesus couldn’t pull it off.


In fact, Jesus didn’t take every invitation. He’d take time to vanish up a mountain for alone time. Why? For our sake. He acknowledged that if he didn’t take care of his own soul – if he were to get cranky and put upon – it would undermine his ministry and the gift of salvation that he came to share.

So as we approach the busy seasons that are upon us, know that you have permission to pick and choose. Likewise, you have the ability to bless others with that same permission rather than insisting that they attend to your expectations.

That doesn't mean there won't be people we miss or who miss us. But by being realistic about how much we are able to share of ourselves, we protect those same relationships. By no means do I intend to dissuade anyone from availing themselves of opportunities to gather together. In the same way, I never intended to need the seat belt on the bus to keep me in place during an accident. Nevertheless, it was good to know that it was there.

That seat belt served another more routine and mundane purpose that may have actually prevented collisions. We drivers relied on the seat belt to hold us in place so that we could apply the torque needed to the steering wheel to navigate corners.

If holiday busyness isn't your challenge, remember that God wants you to take care of yourself and your needs. Whereas society celebrates busyness to the point of exhaustion, God prioritizes taking care of ourselves. It's so important that he made it a commandment to take at least one day to rest each week. God invites you to make taking care of yourself a priority; not just for your sake, but for the sake and safety of those whom you hold dear.




Our next meeting will be November 10<sup>th</sup> following worship. All women of the church are invited to attend.

## Mission Trip

Friends of Cherry Valley ~ You are invited to join me on a mission trip to Tanzania. There is funding available for those that need support. Here is the tentative outline.

### Primary objectives:

- To support and encourage Pastor Kim in her mission work.
- To view her new campus; to understand its purpose; to understand its challenges.
- To experience her work in one of the villages developing discipleship training. (Nifuate training)
- To experience the daily life of the Tanzanian people in urban and rural areas.
- To experience the walk of faith of missionaries
- To grow more deeply in a personal relationship with the Lord!
- To bring back to the church family what is learned; and how to pray for Pastor Kim!

### Length of Stay:

14-16 days (July 13-July 27, 2020)

- 5-8 days will be spent with Pastor Kim in Dar Salaam and at one of the villages.
- 2-3 days in Zanzibar with Pastor Kim.
- 2-4 days in Arusa/Serengeti National Reserve – Safari.

### Tentative cost: \$3350

\*Flight: \$1500 roundtrip

\*Visa: \$100

Room & Board: \$1000 (based on 12 days)

Daily transportation/guide costs: \$200

Ferry: \$50

Flight to Arusa/Serengeti: \$200

Safari: \$300

Job 33:4 "The spirit of God hath made me, and the breath of the Almighty hath given me life."


In the midst of Job's suffering, he was rewarded a revelation of his faith by a revelation of the redeemer.






