





### A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

<sup>11</sup>Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; <sup>12</sup>the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light;

<sup>13</sup>let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. <sup>14</sup>Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

**Romans 13:11-14**

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The "Christmas" season continues to creep earlier and earlier. Radio stations devoted themselves to Christmas/winter music weeks before trick-or-treaters roamed the streets. It won't be long before the annual cavalcade of Christmas movies overwhelm television. My wife will compel (Oops, I mean "invite.") me to join her in watching "White Christmas" and "Christmas in Connecticut" once again. I, on the other hand, prefer the true classics like "Christmas Vacation." Then, there is "A Christmas Story," not only a Christmas favorite but an all-time favorite. I even had a miniature version of a certain "Italian" (i.e. fragil ) major award sitting on my desk at home.

In "A Christmas Story," the main protagonist, nine-year-old Ralph, devotes himself to assuring that he will receive the perfect Christmas gift an "official Red Ryder, carbine action, 200-shot, range model air rifle, with a compass in the stock and this thing that tells time." He sneaks an advertisement into each of his parents magazines. He writes an essay on the virtues of the Red Ryder air rifle for a homework assignment. He "casually" mentions that a friend saw a bear downtown (in Gary, Indiana!). Although several vignettes help to revive nostalgia for the old days, the central theme is Ralph's devotion to what he expects as the greatest manifestation of Christmas.

What do we expect? The Christmas feast was set aside by the Church as an opportunity to celebrate that God became one of us in Jesus Christ, and that he did so that we who are made in his image can reclaim our "godliness." In the early days, Methodism emphasized the importance of holiness – personally and socially. Even today, those preparing to be ordained must affirm they are "moving on to perfection" and expect that it is possible to experience perfection in this life with God's help. Over the years, the centrality of holiness or Christian perfection or sanctification has faded in the Church. In many ways it has become an ideal that we don't really expect to transpire in our own lives or the world.

In "A Christmas Story," Ralph never gave up. He kept planting the seeds. When his mother told him he'd shoot his eye out, he persisted. When his teacher told him that he'd shoot his eye out, he persisted. When Santa told him he'd shoot his eye out, he persisted. He persisted not only hope; but he persisted in sharing that hope with others so that his hope might manifest itself on Christmas morning.

The busyness and commercialism that accompanies our experience in the world regarding Christmas and what to expect can cause us to rethink the hope of actually encountering Jesus or experiencing holiness in this life. So many things can serve to dissuade us from that “unrealistic” hope. It can come from those who hope to protect us, as with a warning about shooting our eye out.

I can promise that finding Jesus on Christmas morning (or any day) will not put your eye out. But will we persist? During the Advent season of preparation in which we anticipate Christ’s return, will we lay out our expectations that holiness and encounter with Jesus is really possible? Will we drop clues for others hoping they too will begin to hope in the *unrealistic*?

Watch the movies and sing the songs. Enjoy them. Most of all, actively hope to meet Jesus this season.



About 200 years ago, Bartimaeus, a blind man, was laid out on his carpet by the side of the road begging. One day he heard a great commotion go by. He wondered who was passing by. The crowd told him, "It is Jesus coming!" Bartimaeus called out to Jesus repeatedly until Jesus asked him "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus said, "Let me see again." Jesus healed him and told him "Your faith has healed you."

Again, while Jesus was walking in a crowd to raise a ruler's dead child, a woman who had an issue of blood for 12 years crawled up behind him and touched his cloak. She said to herself "If only I could touch the hem of his garment, I would become whole." When Jesus felt the woman touch the back of his cloak, He turned around to see who it was. He saw the woman and said to her "Daughter, your faith has made you whole."

## Next Generation Ministries Mission Trip

My dear friends in Christ,

To further support and encourage Pastor Kim, I am planning a trip to Tanzania **in July 2020**. July is a more temperate climate though still hot. Also, the building project should be well underway. This trip will help us to better understand how to pray and support her ministry. Her newsletters and Facebook posts are full of her energy and her heart! Her passion is undeniable! However one learns so much more by seeing it in person. It also means a great deal to a missionary when people come to see where they live and work!

**So, I am inviting you to join me!**

I am extending the baton to you to learn about international missions. It can and often is a life-changing experience. Here is the plan!

### Primary objectives:

- To support and encourage Pastor Kim in her mission work.
- To view her new campus; to understand its purpose; to understand its challenges.
- To experience her work in one of the villages developing discipleship training. (Nifuate training)
- To experience the daily life of the Tanzanian people in urban and rural areas.
- To experience the walk of faith of missionaries
- To grow more deeply in a personal relationship with the Lord!
- To bring back to the church family what is learned; and how to pray for Pastor Kim!

### Length of Stay:

14-16 days (July 13-July 27, 2020)

5-8 days will be spent with Pastor Kim in **Dar Salaam** and at one of the villages.

2-3 days in **Zanzibar** with Pastor Kim.

2-4 days in Arusha/Serengeti National Reserve – **Safari**.

### Tentative cost: \$3500 (estimate)

\*Flight: \$1500 roundtrip

\*Visa: \$100

Room & Board: \$1000 (based on 12 days)

Daily transportation/guide costs: \$200

Ferry: \$60

Flight to Arusha/Serengeti: \$250

Safari: \$300

^Known cost from Morrison Travel Agency. All other costs are estimates. Pastor Kim is working on local costs.

The church has agreed to provide a designated amount of funding through its outreach component. Individual support will depend on how many people choose to go. If you are INTERESTED, please *contact me soon*. I will be in Rockford during the Christmas holidays and we can meet to discuss details. 
