

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ²And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. ⁵But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." ⁸So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

Matthew 28:1-10 (NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

April begins – almost immediately – with Holy Week. April 5 is Palm Sunday leading to Easter Sunday on April 12. For me, Holy Week is the most exciting time of the year. Worship opportunities abound driving us toward the climatic celebration of the Resurrection.

In my youth the new life of Easter manifested itself in the brand new Easter clothes that would serve as my church clothes each Sunday in the upcoming year. I doubt that my mother made much of the theological connection that Easter clothes as Sunday clothes marked each Sunday as an ongoing celebration of Easter. Yet that is the connection. Each Sunday is the same remembrance of the Easter Sunday, even as Easter Sunday itself feels somehow different. Easter Sunday worship is different somehow. Is it the abundance of flowers? The new clothes? The new or seldom seen faces in worship? But is it really different?

I'm reminded of a story (I can't remember the source) about a man who would only attended church on Easter Sunday even though his wife would plead with him to accompany her more often. "Why should I?" He asked, "It's the same thing every time I go."

I refuse to dismiss those whom I may only see at Easter or Christmas, because they are responding to a yearning for the great truth of the Gospel. Yet, at the same time that I profess that every Sunday is the same as we go by the cross acknowledging Jesus' sacrifice upon it, we refuse to get "hung up" there, instead recognizing the power of life we receive in the Resurrection. Does Easter Sunday need novelty to invigorate our enthusiasm for what God has done? No!

However, the Pascha Festival (i.e. the festival of Resurrection) is the primary festival of the Church. Festivals embody enthusiasm. There is an irony that our worship services on Easter Sunday this year will seem novel even though they are ancient expressions of the hope that claims us.

At the sunrise service, we will gather outside the front doors of the church around a kindling fire before processing in the ancient Service of Light that was in the earliest centuries celebrated during the Easter vigil – the most holy and joyful time of the Christian year. During the service we renew our baptism covenant in the tradition of Easter baptism. After breakfast, our "regular" Sunday service will include the pageantry and celebration rightly due to the church. Processions will restore the sanctuary that had been stripped on Holy Thursday and which lay barren for Good Friday reminding us that Christ is risen, indeed.

That <u>same old</u> practice of <u>new</u> clothes for Easter presents a certain irony or paradox. Those Easter clothes of my youth were always best on Easter morning. They were crisp and fit me just right. As the year progressed, the colors faded, the creases waned, pant cuffs and shirt cuffs left more exposed. Yet even this reminded me that Easter was coming and Sunday – the Lord's Day – would be renewed.

Let's gather on April 12 to hear that same story that we hear each Easter that the tomb is empty, but with festive enthusiasm that invigorates our anticipation for encountering Jesus anew each Sunday and every day of the year. Come for something different than the world offers. Come to encounter that same eternal truth that God in Jesus Christ loves you and gives life.

John 13:1 and following...

Before the disciples went to eat at the supper table, their feet had to be washed. Jewish law required this to be done by

slaves or a servant; disciples were not to do this lowly job. Jesus got up, took a basin of water and a towel, and began to wash the disciples feet as a model for them. When Jesus did what the apostles thought was beneath them, it must



have been like a knife in their hearts, convicting them of their pride and unwillingness to be a servant. No wonder Peter said, "You will never wash my feet." (John 13:8). 2020 Bishop's Appeal

Bishop Sally Dyck has designated the Secondary School in Tanzania as the recipient of the 2020 Bishop's Appeal. Churches are encouraged to fundraise to help the second stage of the school's construction and bring their offering to the Northern Illinois Annual Conference in June.

"I am so thrilled to hear this unexpected great news," said Rev. Kim. "Mungu ametenda maajabu, which means God did a great thing." As I started to raise funds for the second stage of school construction, I prayed so many times that many churches in the Northern Illinois Annual Conference would support this mission project. This Bishop's Appeal has increased my faith and set my heart on fire!"

School construction will be finished in three phases. During the first and second phases, the construction will be what the government requires. During the third phase, there will be more construction of facilities, including a multi-purpose hall, a volunteer missionary house, additional classrooms, and an outdoor activity center. We need \$432,764 for the second phase and \$325,500 for the third phase.

Through individual donors and churches, God has provided \$400,000 for the first phase of the school construction.





Information in the system.

Most people have abandoned their land lines and now use

mobile phones exclusively. We need to be sure that we have the most current information on file. If you no longer have a land line, please delete that phone number from your personal information. If you have a mobile phone, please input that information. If you do not want the phone number available in the directory, you may check the box, "private number" and if you don't want your address to be in the directory, select, "hide this address in the directory."

To access the system to change your personal information, add a photo, or access the directory, you:

- 1. Go to the website at cherryvalleyumc.com
- Click on the "member" icon in the red menu line at the top of the page.
- 3. Sign in to the Elexio system by using your email address and password. If you don't remember your password, we can generate a new password that is selected by the system that will be emailed to you.
- 3. Once you access the system, you can go to the bottom of the page and reset your password. Don't forget to save your changes.

Across the top of your page, you have several different menu items that you can access. If you want to change your photo, just click edit and upload your new photo. You can view the directory to get the latest phone numbers, email addresses and view the picture of others on the directory, You can also track your giving at this site.
