

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

³I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you.

⁶For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; ⁷for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. ⁸Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, ⁹who saved us and called us

with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, 10 but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. 11 For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, 12 and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. 13 Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

2 Timothy 1:3-13 (NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

How things have changed in the past month. When I looked back at my message for the April newsletter (written before the restaurants were ordered closed or the shelter-in-place order) I had so much hope about April, Easter, and May. Now there is even doubt whether I will be able to celebrate my grandsons' birthdays (Colin's first) with them at the end of May. My home study – even with the dedicated prayer space and futon for quick naps – has begun to feel like a prison cell at times.

Like Paul, however, I am grateful to God when I remember you constantly in my prayers. Like Paul in his imprisonment, I long to be reunited with all of you: always hoping that it will be sooner rather than later. Unlike Paul, however, I am not a prisoner suffering for the sake of the gospel. As challenging as it is to lead a virtual gathering for worship and the metaphysical and theological challenges that creates, I am encouraged by the commitment of so many in our congregation and others to seek out worship. Ironically, invitations to join in worship and hearing the proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ which had long been ignored or rejected are now starting to bear fruit as family members and friends whose shadows have not darkened the threshold of a church building are "visiting" our worship whether live or recorded. I suspect that anonymous ability to "attend" unnoticed plays a large part.

How many have yearned to hear good news, but have stayed away from churches because so much of what gets presented to the world is the false witness of the prosperity gospel and condemnation? Yet, we bear witness to the truth in Cherry Valley (and now the world) that although Jesus Christ may not have come to condone, that he did not come to condemn but to offer life.

The discouragement of our shared confinement pales in comparison to the encouragement that I have received from so many of you through your emails and telephone calls, the yearning to care for one another, to plan for our time together, and even to continue plans to share the promise of Jesus through Vacation Bible School. These are the things that sustain me in my personal moments of discouragement and in those moments when I get overwhelmed with the practical concerns of the institutional church like finances and good use of our resources. Even then, I find encouragement when I gather the mail from the post office and find that so many of you are continuing in your support of our ministry. Thank you. Although those two words feel inadequate, I can think of no others that would be sufficient.

Let us use this time now to anticipate how we can grow in our ministry. Already this year, our Church Council was making plans for game nights and movie nights in which we could gather in one another's company in a vein that might allow members to invite those suspicious of Christians to some more familiar encounters. So many of you are using your time free from our usual distractions to check in with one another.

In invite you to tell me where you are (maybe a hopeful "were" by the time you read this) finding hope in the midst distancing. What has stirred in your heart? What has the Holy Spirit open your eyes to see? I can't preach like Peter; I can't pray like Paul; but the balm isn't bound to Gilead but springs forth in our midst, today. May our trust in the good grace of God revealed in Jesus Christ serve to sooth and heal a discouraged world.



II Samuel 6

The Philistines had the Ark of the Lord for seven months at this time. It caused many curses by God on the Philistines. The Philistines sent it back to the Israelites. The Ark finally was stored in the house of the Obed-Edom. Obed-Edom was blessed by God because the Ark of the Lord was at his house. King David was asked by his people to bring the Ark to the tabernacle in Jerusalem. When those who bore the Ark had gone 6 paces, the priest and the people would stop and the priest would sacrifice a bull and a fattened calf until they reached the city of Jerusalem and the tabernacle.

The soldiers stripped him of his clothes and pounded nails through his hands and feet for him to hang on the cross. Blood ran down the cross from his many wounds.

Jesus went to the cross and shed His blood for you. He took all of our sins onto himself. For those who accept him as their Savior, their sins are forgiven and all the benefits of the cross are theirs.



Meanwhile, construction on the missionary school continues. Crews are working on roofing and racing to finish before the rainy season comes. "Don't worry about me. I am not panicked and have no fear.
