

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

I write this letter as Susan and I prepare to leave for vacation. We scheduled this time months ago, in order to attend a birthday celebration for my grandsons, Colin (1) and Aaron (3). Because they live in Kansas City, we aren't able to visit often. Therefore, we were looking forward to the opportunity to hold and hug them; to tell them we love them and to enjoy their presence. Things changed.

Knowing that it would be unlikely to find other camping reservations, we still plan on travelling to Kansas City; (Waiting on confirmation that the campground will be open.) but we don't expect to spend any time with my daughter or grandsons. We decided that even if the party were to occur, we'd stay away. That hurts. However, as much as I want to celebrate their birthdays with them, I much prefer that they get the best chance to celebrate birthday's next year. To that end, we expect to drive by the house, to drop off gifts (properly stored and sanitized), and to wave from the roadside. It's not ideal; but it is something and it doesn't detract from our love for one another.

For more than two months, we've been unable to gather like we're used to gathering for worship. Those who join via our ZOOM gatherings can see one another's name and can share prayers together. It's not ideal; but it is something and it reveals our continuing love for one another. For that, I am grateful. Like Paul, I give thanks to God for each of you and the witness your "attendance" provides.

It looks like we'll be doing worship like this at least for the next month. Our bishop has assembled a team to develop a plan for best practices when are able to worship in person. Even though I hope for sooner rather than later, it will be different. Regardless of what recommendations come out, our love for one another means we will have to worship differently. At a minimum we will spread out by alternating pews, everyone attending in person will wear a mask, we'll rely more on the display screen as pew bibles and hymnals will be stored away lest they become harbors for the virus, communion would be distributed differently, and we'd have to

refrain from physical greeting like hugs and handshakes and even elbow bumps.

It won't be ideal but it can be something. We'll have to limit the number of people attending, not because we want to be apart, but because we love one another. When we are able to "open", we'll need to continue to livestream our worship services so that those who are most vulnerable may still witness the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ with us.

What was normal isn't normal anymore. Our choice isn't whether to accept or reject the new normal: it will be what it is. Our choice is whether we will embrace our commitment to love one another and to love our neighbors as the new normal unfolds.

Even though Susan and I are travelling, our travelling will change. Now, rather than finding a pit stop, we'll be using the facilities in our camper on the road. Rather than taking a meal break in a restaurant, PB&J will provide on the road nourishment. We're making those changes for a reason. We don't want to become a vector for anyone whom we love. Even though Missouri will be "opened up", we'll forgo some of the sights and stops that we'd intended to enjoy.

I understand the frustration that many people have with all that has been shut down. I too am frustrated; but I also recognize that everything isn't about me. To that end, I'm committed to wearing a mask whenever I'm in shop or business. (Although I expect I'll have to take it off to have my beard trimmed.) It may be inconvenient and for some a bit uncomfortable; but as Christians we recognize that John 3:16 says that God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that whomever believed in him might have life. God didn't allow Jesus to die on that cross for his sake, but for ours.

During this time while we wait for that day when we can be together, even as we mourn what was, let us be beacons of love for one another and for the world. Wear a mask even if you feel okay, not only to protect others but to put those overwhelmed by anxiety and fear at ease. Stay home when you feel a little bit sick. Even when we're allowed to resume some activities, let us do so only in moderation, holding ourselves to a higher standard as we explore what we can do: for ourselves and for our love for one another and the world.

Many of you have continued to be faithful in your giving. We thank you. You have a few options for continued giving:



Despite the pandemic, construction on the Global Missions Secondary School, the recipient of this year's Bishop's Appeal, continues. "Confirmed cases of COVID-19 are increasing every day but there is no emphasis on social distancing," said Rev. Kim who added people are hungry and lacking sanitary supplies. Rev. Kim said if churches would like to donate to her Advance indicating the donation is for COVID-19 relief, she will work toward providing food and supplies to those in need. Fundraising is also continuing for the construction of the school, which is slated to be completed by Jan. 2021.

Luke 18:1-8:


Persevering Prayer—The Parable of the Unjust Judge.

"In a certain city was a judge who feared not God nor regarded man." The judge was utterly selfish and godless. He did not care for anyone's opinion. "And there was a widow who came to the judge saying, 'Avenge me of my adversary'. (She is asking for justice)."

The widow was poor, friendless, and without any influence. She came repeatedly asking for help. The adversary is typical of Satan, as Peter says in Peter 5:8, "...your adversary, the devil, like a roaring lion walks about seeking who he can destroy." The widow asks the judge repeatedly for help and because she constantly worried him with her requests, the judge gave in to her.

Jesus chose the judge to represent God. But, Jesus goes to great lengths to tell us that God is long-suffering, the loving sign of loving and gentle patience. Jesus tells us "...men should always pray and faint not..." Don't lose heart, don't give up. God will hear our prayers and answer them speedily for those that worship Him and are His own elect and call on Him day and night.


# Accessing the Directory Via Our Website




