A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel ⁶that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. ⁷This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, ⁸and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's

will in all)spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. ¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully

¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. **Colossians 1:5b-12 (NRSV)**

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

March comes in like a lion, then goes out like a lamb: so the saying goes. Except that the lion seems to have stuck around much later than usual. While waiting anxiously to plant the vegetables which I've started indoors, I heard that snow could be in the forecast in late April. What about those April showers that lead to May flowers?

I'm looking forward to flowers. I've seen a few hardy blossoms popping up in the forest preserve during my daily hikes. My neighbor's daffodils have already appeared, but they've needed cover (extra protection) to preserve them against the cold. Not even Solomon in all his glory was clothed with the beauty of the lilies. (Mt 6:29) Flowers are wonderful.

Flowers provide a flash of color that actually make the green and brown grass prettier. Flowers add an aroma of hope and promise. The right kind of flowers even keep the mosquitos away, allowing us to enjoy summer more fully.

The colors and the smell serve to attract bees, hummingbirds, and butterflies. Their nectar nourishes each, and even leads to the sweet honey that brings joy to our lives. However, that is not their purpose.

Flowers serve the plant leading to pollination to produce fruit. The blossoms appearing on the trees in front of the church will soon become cherries. The blossoms which I hope to see soon in my garden will yield snap peas, tomatoes, squash and water-melon. Flowers that are cut and placed in a vase to be gazed upon, never get to produce fruit (seeds).

In the church, we sometimes face a paradox about flowers. Either we get so focused on doing good deeds (i.e. producing fruit) that we forget that flowers (beauty) are

essential in the process; or we emphasize providing appealing activities (including worship) that will display the church's beauty that we deny the opportunity to yield fruit. We need both.

To bear fruit - to bring the hope of salvation and all it entails to others - requires a church with appeal and purpose. At the same time we must recognize, that some things take time. The seeds which I planted in early March await transplantation to the garden. Even if I'm lucky, tomatoes won't arrive until June; watermelons and winter squash much later. Will the wait be worth it?

Recently, I heard from a church member who told me about her granddaughter and her family. As a child the granddaughter attended Cherry Valley United Methodist Church on weekends and during summers when visiting her grandparents. That was the extent of her exposure to church. Although she had found memories of that experience, as an adult, she didn't attend church. Eventually she married a self-avowed atheist. As their family expanded with the addition of two children, still no church and no direct sense of Christ's presence in their home.

Then they moved. The husband had to be away for three weeks at a time for work. During that time the next door neighbors' children who had befriended their children, invited them to attend church with them. Mom and the kids accepted the invitation. When dad arrived home for his three weeks at home before going away for work again, the kids were up early getting dressed on Sunday morning. "What's going on?" "We're going to church." Dad - the atheist - even joined them.

From the car, the granddaughter sent her grandmother a picture of the family with the captioned, "On our way home from church." Just to be sure, the grandmother asked for confirmation. Yes, the entire family had been attending church. Eventually, she'd receive a video in which mom, the two children, and even dad were baptized in their backyard pool (Covid restrictions prevented using the church baptistery). Imagine grandmother's joy. Imagine heaven's joy.

That grandmother and this congregation had planted and nurtured the flower of faith which eventually bore fruit. That flower served to attract a young girl with music, the joy of fellowship, and the wonderful words of life in Scripture. Then when another flower appeared in neighbors whose lives showed forth the hope that Christ alone provide and then extended an invitation to see and experience, when the light shined, and the water of baptism rained upon them the church bore fruit. The church in Tennessee, the church here in Cherry Valley, and the church universal has drawn four souls to the promise of life abundant.

As the cherry blossoms appear outside the church in the next few weeks preceding the promise of cherries to follow, let us consider how our life together as a church and our individual lives will serve to attract the flighty humming birds, flitty butterflies, and even stinging bees to the promise of new life through God's love. Church Management Software

The church has transitioned to a different format software management program.

The new program allows us to record on-line giving directly into the database, along with access to an app that will allow church members to view upcoming events, record worship attendance (even while joining via YouTube or ZOOM), update contact information, view the church directory, and more.

Download the app and select Cherry Valley United Methodist Church as your church. Although there is an option to "request an account" it is not needed if we have your email address and cellphone number. Merely enter your e-mail address and cell phone number. If they match what we have in our records, you will receive a texted confirmation code to complete the setup.

We are still working with the new format and learning new things. It is very different from the previous version, so please bear with us as we transition to this new phase.

Please watch for improvements to come. Also, you may give to the church via text (still have to follow a link), by sending a text to: 815-393-5435 EZEKIEL with either the word "give" or "gift". Likewise, "here" will lead you to attendance, and "pray" will lead you to a prayer request form.

Next Generation Ministries in Tanzania

As you all know, Rev. Young Seon (Christina) Kim is a missionary and Director of Next Generation Ministries in Tanzania. We have seen the progress of the secondary school in many of the articles she has shared with us. It has been a long, arduous undertaking, but the school is now finally open. Please continue to support this mission with prayers and if you have the means, monetary donations. Below is an excerpt by Rev. Kim from a previous article detailing Next Generations Mission.

The Next Generation Ministries exist to empower Tanzanian youth (age 13-35) to become healthy, growing, and devoted followers of Jesus Christ. The Next Generation Ministries provides essential Christian trainings, retreats, seminars, sponsorships, scholarships, and resources to fulfill its God-given vision. It is committed to serve youth in and beyond the United Methodist Church of Tanzania. Since June 2015, it has been hosting a youth leadership retreat every three months. Continuity, allowing the gradual development of spiritual growth, is essential. Between retreats, I visit local churches in different districts, meet with church leaders and the youth, provide leadership trainings, and encourage them to follow the Word of God and the Holy Spirit. These two practices have inspired the youth and their churches. Also, I got a grant from Young People's Ministries of the GBOD. I have been preparing for Swahili training materials for discipleship, leadership, and UMC & UMCT history study. I always look for mission partners and sponsors who want to make a difference in young people's lives. Through sponsorships and scholarships, 4 young adults study at the Grace Bible college. 2 youth study at King's Vision Secondary School. 9 young adults learned English, and 3 young adults will study at VETA vocational training schools.

*I would like to see youth building a good foundation of their life in the Word of God.

*I would like to see youth pursing their dreams, serving God in/outside the church, and doing the right thing for their community.

*I would like to see youth empowering other youth with their talents and experiences and getting actively involved in their community.

*I would like to see youth becoming a driving force for their church development and revival.

*I would like to see strong pastoral and lay leaders who will bring people together and make the community move forward for fulfilling its mission.


sonally to those we are praying for. In prayer, we can touch others in need and change situations that are all around the globe. This is the power of prayer through the Holy Spirit.
