

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

^{18:1}At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" ²He called a child, whom he put among them, ³and said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. ⁴Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. ⁵Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me. ⁶"If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea.

Matthew 18:1-6 (NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

I heard an unfamiliar noise Monday morning August 9th. I'd just hit the snooze button anticipating a few more minutes of sleep before arising to take the dogs for our "daily" hike in the forest preserve when I heard it: a clap of thunder and then the sound of rain. Was it real? Or a wishful hope? What fortuitous timing.

Rain had been forecast in the afternoon and early evening Friday, August 6th and again during the day on Saturday, August 7th. As much as our community needed rain, that forecast led to anxiety: We were hosting Vacation Bible School outdoors (due to COVID) under a tent those two days. Although warm, the weather was perfect. Even that Sunday when children shared their praise for God's faithfulness in our midst along with parents and grandparents (either strangers or infrequent visitors) filling the sanctuary, the sun shined from the sky as the Son shined through those children. God's timing was perfect.

As I pray that the drought that has dried out our lawns and lowered the water table in our community has come to an end, I'm reminded of another drought facing our larger community. The fastest growing "religious" affiliation in our country (and in much of the northern hemisphere) is none. Although there is a tendency to bemoan a decrease in church membership in denominations and congregations, it merely represents the symptoms of a greater drought. Consider that the grass turns brown as it withers and flowers fade when rain eludes the earth, but life thrives when rain and sunshine are abundant. Isaiah 40:8 says, "The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever."

Too often the Church asks how it can grow as if the drought is a lack of participants rather than a dearth of hope brought on by hoarding (i.e. not sharing) the good news (the gospel) that each soul is made in the image of God Almighty, and our unique proclamation that that very same God entered our suffering even to the point of death so that everyone who claims that promise might have hopeful and eternal life. For thirteen children and their families – for the leaders who volunteered their time and the benefactors who supported Vacation Bible School with additional offerings – that drought was broken for a moment that first full weekend of August.

Whereas an intermittent shower may help our lawns and gardens survive for a few more days or weeks, thriving requires consistent rainfall. Doesn't it? After a drought, it takes time for lawns and gardens to fully recover and to begin growing beyond the limits of our backyards and garden plots. Doesn't it?

Grass withers and flowers fade; but the word of our God stands forever. How do we persist in sharing that word of hope? In the passage above, Jesus calls us to welcome children in his name. He also warns us about creating stumbling blocks. What might those stumbling blocks be? Extra time serving children's ministry by those who have "done my time"? Reluctance to invest financial resources to bring children to gather with the faithful for Sunday School and worship so that might receive the constant watering that will allow them to blossom? Fear of "practical" considerations regarding messes in the building, etc.? Forgetting that our call as the Church (the body of Christ in the world) is to share the hope of salvation rather than prolonging institutional survival.

In the parable of the lost sheep, Jesus says that "there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (Luke 18:10) Allow me to rephrase that: joy abounds in heaven for each soul that learns to trust God, because God is faithful.

I am convinced that God is calling Cherry Valley United Methodist Church to make it our priority to share the gospel hope with children; and that by doing so, we'll forget about surviving because God's love will be thriving.

A couple of months ago, I mentioned one of my ideas on how to expand our outreach to children. I don't know whether that was merely Mark's (my) idea in response to the God's call or God's directive. I will say again, however, that I am convinced that God's call is for us to share the good news with children. Doing so will require investing our time and treasure in that ministry. I am convinced, also, that God will put on your hearts how best to implement that call. I am also convinced that whatever he instills in you will be better than any idea that I can imagine. Trust God and share those inspirations so that we can discern together how to respond to God's call.

I'm still waiting for watermelons to grow in my garden almost four months after planting the seeds; and know that I have at least a month more to wait for the harvest. Likewise, it will take time for the seeds of faith planted in young lives to take root, to sprout up, to blossom, and to bear fruit. When we are faithful planting those seeds, feeding those roots, protecting the shoots, and pouring out the water of hope that God instills in us when we see drought surrounding those youn lives, that we will find our own hope renewed and our anticipation grow as we wait to see even one soul filled with the hopeful promise of life that comes through Jesus Christ. 
