A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

¹O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

²Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!

³For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

⁴In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.

⁵The sea is his, for he made it, and the dry land, which his hands have formed.

⁶O come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker! ⁷For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture,

and the sheep of his hand. O that today you would listen to his voice! ⁸Do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah,

as on the day at Massah in the wilderness,

⁹when your ancestors tested me, and put me to the proof,

though they had seen my work. ¹⁰For forty years I loathed that generation and said,

"They are a people whose hearts go astray, and they do not regard my ways."

¹¹Therefore in my anger I swore,

"They shall not enter my rest." Psalm 95 (NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Psalm 95, above, is known as the *Venite*. *Venite* means *come* in Latin, This psalm serves as a regular call to worship in the Book of Common Prayer and the Lutheran Book of Worship. In The Book of Worship of The United Methodist Church, it is one of the recommended Scripture readings for morning prayer.

"Come, let us sing to the Lord, let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation... For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods... The seas is his... the dry lands are his... come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker!" I invite you to say those words out loud. Read them above especially verses one (1) through seven (7): say them and listen to your voice as you do. Could you read them in a monotone? Did you? Or did you start that way, and begin to have something new come over you?

Sometimes I've been frustrated reading the psalms in unison when gathered with Anglican brothers and sisters. There's an intentionality about keeping an almost monotone tone so that our individual inflections don't overpower a unified voice. That may influence my affection for chanting/singing the psalms. Methodist's can do that. It's not too Catholic, Episcopalian, Lutheran... Have you ever noticed those little red dots over words in the psalter at the end of our hymnal? Those are chant marks. But, I digress: such is the power of singing God's praise.

In the psalm above we are encouraged to come before the Maker of the Universe, as a God whose name we know and who claims us as his, and who yearns for us to listen to (and for) his voice.


Our God is distinct from all other gods. Our God calls us into a different sort of relationship than any other god. All other gods – the pagan gods of Rome and Greece, the Norse and Hindu deities, the gods of Egypt and the ancient gods of sub-Saharan Africa and the America – are deities to be appeased and whose relationships to humanity are transactional. Our God – the Maker of creation – says, "I made you to be like me," and, "Rather than demanding that you do things to earn my favor, I am going to entrust you with the whole earth. Even though the sea is mine because I made it – even though the earth is mine because my hands formed it, I'm entrusting it all to you to care for it and for one another."

I'm not worthy. Are you? I'm not worthy, except that I've been made in God's image, and reborn through Jesus Christ. How can I be anything other than joyful in God's presence? How can I keep thanksgiving from overwhelming my soul? If that sounds a little too perfect; that's probably because it is.

I confess, I am not always thankful. Too often, I let the worries of the world distract me from knowing the joy that God chose me – God chose you – to trust and to love. Because God can't be wrong, I must be worthy. To often, I allow myself to fret over whether I'm liked or respected by other, and I put God to the test, as if he needs to answer to me. In so doing, I notice what I don't have rather than the blessings that abound.

We are a blessed people: not be cause of our good fortune to live in a powerful nation, not because we may (or may not) have financial security, not because we belong to the "right" religion; but because we've heard the Word and experienced the promise that God chose us over every other creature to be like him. Moreover, God refuses to give up on us. He saved a remnant from the flood and sent Jesus to take our sin – our tendency to forget who we are and to seek satisfaction in our own devices. Even in the psalm above where it seems like God is giving up, we are reminded that because God loves us, he'll let us have our own way when we overlook the blessings we've been afforded.

As the pandemic continues and people stay away from churches for health concerns or out of habit, it would be easy to wonder whether God has given up on us or whether we might be giving up on God; but things are happening here: our growing attendance surpasses even some other "larger" congregations in our region and does so without neglecting practical (even if inconvenient) guidelines for inhibiting the spread of disease, Sunday School has resumed including at least one family who attended Vacation Bible School. We have two baptisms scheduled on the church calendar: one on October 31 when we celebrate All Saints Sunday, and another on November 7 when we'll be invited to renew our support for the missions and ministry of Cherry Valley United Methodist Church.

Sometimes the word on the screen may get behind or the livestream broadcast might go wonky – sometimes the preacher will lose his place (or forgets to load up his sermon), or a reader may stumble on a word or phrase in Scripture. We come to make a joyful noise that God has chosen each of us and all of us together. We come to his presence with thanksgiving that each of us has been blessed with something to give for the sake of the world – and the church of Jesus Christ.

We have children in Sunday School! We have a new space in the back of the sanctuary where children can remain in worship and still fidget! We have singing! We have praying! We have old friends sitting together! We have new friends coming to know one another! We the hosts of heaven cheering us on as we waken God's joy through our joyful noise! Come, let us sing to the LORD and enter his presence with thanksgiving.

In the next month, you should be receiving a devotional for our "Desserts First" stewardship campaign (If not, contact the church and we'll get one to you either printed or electronically) in which members of our faith community share and reflect on why they are thankful and how they express that. I hope you will avail yourself of that devotional blessed to know that others are being encouraged by the exact same words. I would invite you also to begin each day in the upcoming month – whether as a part of that devotional or not – with Psalm 95 so that you may find yourself in God's presence as a sheep of his own fold each day and each moment.

This was especially useful in the time when many persons could not read but memorized the psalms and other passages for communal worship. PS: I mentioned above that there are two upcoming baptisms: Ryan Bilderback (October 31) and Cole Dwyer (November 7). I ask for at <u>least</u> six persons to join me in fasting and prayer for baptismal candidates on the day prior to a baptism. We don't have to limit ourselves to six. For those who choose to fast: a spiritual fast usually consists of forgoing morning and mid-day meals, and then having a light evening meal devoid of particularly rich foods. It serves to remind us of what we need and the abundance that we normally enjoy. In this context, it anticipates an abundance of God's grace for the baptized. Even if you don't choose to fast on September 30 or November 6, please pray for Ryan and Cole on those days.





Miracle at a Funeral

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21

This is a story from Greg, a translation consultant with whom Craig has worked in a Bible translation project not too far from where we live. Greg wrote:

"A few years ago, Tawan returned home after becoming a Christian to live in his family's village and translate the Bible into their language. He and his father Tasai were harvesting Tasai's rice crop, and rain was approaching the fields threatening to ruin their crop. Tasai said to Tawan, 'If your God is so great, ask Him to stop the rain!' Tawan told me he didn't have the faith, but prayed anyway and asked God to somehow stop it from raining on their crops. In no time a wind came and blew the rain away from their fields. This exact scenario happened three years in a row. After the third time, Tasai decided his son's God was real, and he wanted to know Him. Tasai gave his life to Jesus.

"Last September, after battling an illness for a few years, Tasai died at the hospital but was resuscitated. He told us all about being taken up to heaven by someone dressed in white and meeting Jesus. Jesus told him that he couldn't go in yet, but had to wait for a few more days. Tasai had a huge smile on his face as he told many people about his experience and how much he was looking forward to going to heaven. This is so different from how most people here view death. They are terrified of what comes next. Tasai peacefully passed away a week later.

"During the 3-day funeral wake, hundreds of people came to visit and pay their respects. Many of those who came had never been to a Christian funeral. It was a great opportunity to have a short service each night with worship, and someone sharing about the hope we have in Jesus.

"It is normal for every house in a village to give a donation to help cover funeral expenses. However, Tawan's family had been told by the elders in their village that anyone who became a Christian would be excluded from that community plan. On the last night during the service, the governor of the district publicly gave Tawan an envelope of money equal to the amount of the typical village donation. He said the reason he did this was that they didn't have any alcohol or gambling at this funeral. (Every other funeral we have attended in Thailand has included alcohol and gambling, but not Tasai's because they are Christians!)"


