## A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

)In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. <sup>2</sup>This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. <sup>3</sup>All went to their own towns to be registered. <sup>4</sup>Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. <sup>5</sup> He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. <sup>6</sup>While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. <sup>7</sup>And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Luke 2:1-7(NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

"Close the door! Were you born in a barn?" My mom knew that I wasn't born in a barn. After all, she was there. What was a kid to do? The best response would be to simply shut the door. Right? Why miss the opportunity for a witty retort? "If it was good enough for Jesus, then it's good enough for me?" Looking back, sassing one's mother wasn't good enough for Jesus, and it wasn't good enough for me. Moreover, what if my retort wasn't right at all?

Although my mother will have arrived to spend Thanksgiving with Susan and I, she won't have to worry about spending the night in a barn. She'll be staying with us. When Susan and I travel to Pennsylvania to visit her (and to travel down to Baltimore so that she can see her great-grandsons), we'll stay at my sister's home. That's what people do when they are away from home visiting family. Isn't it?

We all know that when Joseph and Mary arrived in Bethlehem they were desperately trying to find a room in a local hotel because Jesus' birth was imminent. Right? We all know that Jesus was born in a stable because there were no rooms to be had. Right? How do we know that? The Bible? Really?

Why did they travel to Bethlehem for the census? Even though Joseph didn't live in Bethlehem, it was still the family hometown (see v. 4 above), just as Peoria is for my family. Why would they go to a hotel? Was it desperation to find a place right away? Let's look again: "While they were there, the time came..." (see v. 6 above) They hadn't just arrived in town. Had they been hanging out on the streets waiting for Mary's water to break before looking for a room in a hotel? That doesn't make sense either. Does it? Finally, nowhere in the passage is a stable or barn mentioned. A manger: yes.

If we're honest, most of what we "know" about the nativity comes from children's Christmas pageants rather than the Bible. A lot of that proceeds from a mistranslation in the Authorized Translation (i.e. KJV) of the word *kataluma* ( $\kappa\alpha\tau\alpha\lambda\nu\mu\alpha\tau\iota$ ). In the KJV (and subsequent translations) the word "inn" appears twice in Luke: here in verse 2:7 and again in 10:34 in the story of the good Samaritan. The Greek word is different, however.

In the good Samaritan story which clearly references an inn as we know it, the word used is *pandocheion* ( $\pi\alpha\nu\sigma\iota\sigma\nu$ ). We might think that the terms are synonymous, except that *kataluma* appears once more in Luke 22:12 as the "upper room" where Jesus would gather with his disciples to hold the last supper. Other translations such as the New Jerusalem Bible translate kataluma as "living-space" or "guest room."

The typical home in Palestine was a one room house with a lowered "foyer" in which animals stayed for the night. However, a second "guest room" was not uncommon. When we look again at the passage above we discover that when Luke tells us that there is no room in the "inn", what he's really telling us is that place was so crowded with his family that the only place to set the child was in the hole carved into the stone floor for animal feed.

It makes sense. Doesn't it? If God really did intend to dwell among as one of us, he'd choose to do it amidst a gathering of loving family.

I missed gathering for Christmas Eve worship (It was awfully cold in the parking lot last year), celebrations with friends, and gathering with family last year. I suspect you feel the same way.

This year, large family gatherings are still questionable. But the good news is that we are able to more safely visit those whom we love. Take time this season to celebrate the opportunities you do have to be with family. Don't allow disappointment for what could be, detract from squeezing every moment of joy you can in small gatherings, or even in FaceTime/Skype/ZOOM calls. There may be no room for gathering as we'd like, but just as Mary found a place for Jesus, we too can find our place to make love present for one another.




## You Tube Live Streaming


