
By choosing to yield the responsibility for daily vacuuming (a necessity with two dogs) to Hazel, Susan and I have more time to devote to the things that depend upon us. Hazel and other "smart" devices are there to free us for our purposes. However, there have been problems; not because Hazel is such a busybody, but because her first day made too much work.

On her first day, I found myself having to respond to Hazel's nagging alerts: "Bin is full," "sensors dirty," etc. Who's in charge here, anyway? (Thinking back to the sit-com, maybe "Hazel" is the right name.) Fortunately, Hazel hasn't needed much attention since that first day(except after her first day off).

What if Hazel did need more attention? Then what? What if I had to stop what I was doing two or three times a day to "help" the vacuum cleaner? Time that I (or Susan) could have vacuumed? Wouldn't that make me Hazel's servant?

In many ways, we are servants to our stuff. We may work longer hours and spend less time with our families so that we can afford stuff and maintaining stuff that will bring comfort to our lives, and provide for those whom we love. Without meaning to do so, we can go down that path of investing so much in things, that we actually miss out on the comfort (relationships) of life that that those things were supposed to provide. To make up for it, we begin a vicious cycle doing more of the same. Most of the time, it's not readily obvious that that is happening.

That's often how sin creeps into our lives. We engage in something good or useful. Then we start to view that good activity or useful thing as the goal rather than a means to being who God made us to be – holy beings made in the divine image – made to love.

Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin." (Jn. 8:34) We don't usually think about it that way; but it's true. Sin enslaves us: either by the time and effort we spend trying to justify ourselves, or by the energy we spend hiding. More than that it keeps us from allowing God to love us. Likewise, everyone who's things have become the aspiration (even as a proxy for relationships and time with those whom we love) has become a slave to things. They own us, in the same way that when we sin, sin owns us

Who "owns" you? What was supposed to serve me which now hounds me? These are not easy questions, but one which we need to ask ourselves. Jesus paid for us on the cross, not because God owed the devil anything, but because the shame of our burden has stolen our capacity to expect that we can know what it is like to be like God.

I've wanted a robot vacuum cleaner for years. I waited until the price came down; and I waited until it could empty itself. What would be the point in a robot that makes me work every day? I measured the benefits: Less dog hair and dirt puts Mark in a more pleasant mood for Susan. Less time vacuuming (Mark or Susan) is more time to hold hands on a walk or relax in the hammock. I also considered the cost: Would I yield my sense of self by letting the robot do this job? (NO!) Would the purchase create angst leading me to consider giving less than my tithe and offerings to the church and the other charities that I support (Things that serve me as a child of God.)? No. Hazel serves me. I serve the Lord.

Yet I know that I have to keep vigilant. Hazel's presence has made me ponder whether there is a place in the house (outside really) for Groundskeeper Willie (i.e. a robot lawn mower). What's the cost? Not only is a robot mower as expensive as a new riding lawnmower, but I value time mowing when I can "not hear" anyone else. Is that worth it? Not right now, I'd give up too much to something that is supposed to serve me. Right now, a "Groundskeeper Willie" might as well be named "Hal". I'd rather trust Jesus with opening Heaven's gate, than Hal with the bay doors.

With so many things weighing on us (inflation, the ongoing pandemic, political/social vitriol), let us be mindful of those things that might distract us from God's purpose in our lives, even while we take advantage of opportunities to free our time and energy for one another.
