A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

³³Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" ³⁴Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" ³⁵Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" ³⁶Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." ³⁷Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

(John 18:33-37 NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

You may have heard that Elizabeth II – queen of the United Kingdom – died recently. Reports of her death – her funeral – and expectations regarding her successor, Charles III, proliferated all sorts of media. Although, I found it odd that American news organizations gave this so much attention – considering that Americans dispensed with monarchy under her great-great-great-great grandfather George III – the death of any world leader is newsworthy when we consider how it might transform relationships between countries.

At her passing, she had served as head-of-state for longer than most current world leaders have even been alive. That was newsworthy. Although I had some familiarity with the British crown (In seminary, I wrote a paper on Mary Queen of Scots – Elizabeth II's great-great... grandmother, ironically executed by Elizabeth I), it does seem odd that people expect some sort of great change now that Charles has ascended that throne.

Even though British monarchs serve as head-of-state and head of the Church of England, they have no real power. Although Elizabeth II may have appointed the Archbishop of Canterbury and the prime minister, it was no more than formality. Even though laws in the UK require the monarch's assent, it's really a perfunctory gesture (It's only happened once in the last 400 years, and that was more than 200 years ago.).

One of the concerns that I heard mentioned by some in the UK was that Charles might actually want to actually involve himself in governing, rather than acquiescing to Parliament's direction. It made me ponder what people expect from God. Are we satisfied with our religion as long as God doesn't involve himself too much in our lives?


As Christians, we claim Jesus Christ as King of kings and Lord of lords. When Israel first asked Samuel for a king to be like the others around them, with a broken heart, he prayed; and the answer came when, "the LORD said to Samuel, 'Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them." (1 Sam 8:7).

Most of the world's monarchs today serve as figureheads. They have few real powers. If they did exercise those powers, they'd be stripped away.

What do we expect of God revealed in Jesus Christ? Do we look to turn to him for guidance and direction, trusting him? Or do we expect (demand?) that he will assent to that which we intend?

Is Jesus Christ merely a figurehead for the Church? Or is he our Lord and King? Unlike the world's kings (when they had power), Jesus doesn't demand that we subjugate ourselves to him. But that doesn't mean that his authority is merely figurative. Instead, he gives us the choice to accept him or to reject him for who he is.

The news is filled with reports that the church is in decline. So we look for ways to appeal to the world around us, which seems to have accelerated that decline. Could it be like the rest of the world, we have effectively rejected our king? The stated mission of The United Methodist Church is "is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world," not the other way around.

I confess that many times I wish God would just ratify my decisions, like the British monarch does for his subjects. That logic depends on an impotent God. What's the point in that?

In Revelation 3:15-16, 20, we hear, "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. ... Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me."

Knock, knock. // Who's there? // Jesus loves. // Jesus loves who? // Jesus loves you. Whether others choose to follow or not; let us be wise enough to look to Jesus, our King, for guidance that leads to life, rather than as a figurehead to approve our own whims.

Two Boy Scouts also attended and presented the colors at the beginning of the service. Three of the adult Scout Leaders were in attendance as well.




Pastor Mark's sermon was very topical as he spoke about acts of kindness, the need for community and the heartfelt meaning of service.

In 2016 when I obeyed God's calling to build a Global Mission secondary school, God gave me a word "extension." I asked him what that means. He explained to me that GMSS is not only a school, but also a mission strategic base. This God-given vision influenced me so greatly that a multipurpose hall, a cafeteria, dormitories, classrooms were designed much bigger than government's guidelines. GMSS can accommodate up to 250 people.

This week GMSS was used for "3-Day Prayer" ministry. i considered this 3-Day Prayer as the official beginning of GMSS' extension work for Christ and His Kingdom. I was so thrilled to see prayer warriors sent by 4 district superintendents (Dar es Salaam, Pwani, Morogoro, Dodoma) and so overwhelmed by the great sounds of intercessory prayers.

I praise God for His goodness and Mercy on prayer warriors from 5 different regions, who gathered to intercede for our Bishop Mande, churches in 12 districts, God's mission in and beyond Tanzania. Our last session was about each person sharing thanksgiving and testimony. Listening to them was a great joy and encouragement to my heart. Our next meeting will be in December after the school is closed. I hope and pray that God will enable Anna and me to extend our invitations to all districts.

"Lord, let your Holy fire spread to all districts and all churches. Forgive our sins and fill us with you Holy Spirit. Let your churches commit to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and make disciples until we see You face to face. Amen."

With God's grace we grow together! Please continue to pray and support Pastor Kim's work. Pray for the students as they take their national exams in November.
