# A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

<sup>9</sup>As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. <sup>10</sup>And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. <sup>11</sup>When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" <sup>12</sup>But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. <sup>13</sup>Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

(Matthew 9:9-13 NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The Lenten season serves to prepare us for Easter and invites us to renew our expectation of Resurrection hope. Too often, Christians give in to a notion of Lenten devotion as a sort of mini purgatory in which we deprive ourselves of pleasure and joy as a testament to our devotion to God lest we suffer punishment. Even though, as Protestants, we rightly reject the concept of purgatory, we often live our lives and express our faith in the context of a God whom we must appease.

What comes to mind when you hear the word *salvation*? What about *sin*? How do you distinguish between *Sin* and *sins*? What does Jesus do for us in this regard? Obviously, I've asked those questions to make a point.


In the New Testament, the word we see as Sin/sins comes from the Greek word harmatia ( $\dot{\alpha}\mu\mu\alpha\tau\dot{\alpha}$ ), an archery term that means to "miss the mark". It's easy to think of *sins* as things which we do wrongly. That's not incorrect. In that context, *Sin* is our tendency to do wrong. When we think of Sin and sins this way, salvation logically presents itself as rescue from the consequences (e.g. punishment) for doing wrong. What if there is something else happing as well?

The Greek word sozo ( $\sigma\omega\zeta\sigma$ ) gets translated a couple of different ways in Scripture: sometimes as "save", and other times (more frequently) as "heal." Both are appropriate in the sense of deliverance from danger: a threat or disease.

What if we were to look at Sin as a disease rather than predilection? If Sin is a disease, then God's word to the Man in the Garden that he would die if he disobeyed is a cautionary warning rather than a threat. Likewise, our experience of Sin isn't because we share Adam's guilt, but because an infection was let loose that contaminates creation.





It is telling that when Jesus was derided for his association with sinners that he used a metaphor of healing and disease. Our sins matter and we are responsible for the things that we do. However, in Jesus we find something far more important than forgiveness for our transgressions. Through his death on the cross he offers us a cure for Sin.

When our bodies are sick, we have a few choices: We can complain; we can ignore it hoping that it will go away on its own; we can attend to the symptoms while the disease persists; or we can look for a cure through good medicine and healthy living.

Rather than looking at Lent or any period of intentional devotion/re-devotion merely as a means to purge ourselves of sinful action (attending to symptoms), but instead to look at our acts of devotion (prayer, poring over God's love letter in Scripture, joining and encouraging one another in worship) as gifts that allow us to receive true healing through Jesus Christ.


# LENTEN JOURNEY
