
Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

A new year is upon us. Although there's a 50/50 chance that I will be tucked in my bed asleep when the clock strikes midnight, I know that celebrations including fireworks and revelry will mark the transition from the past year into the next. It recently occurred to me: Why? What do we really celebrate on New Year's Eve? Are we celebrating that the past year is *finally past*? Or are we celebrating the possibilities that lie ahead?

I suspect it's a combination of both, but with more emphasis on future possibilities. However, the upcoming year will not be without its challenges, even from the beginning. The hubris of political campaigns will amplify. As a denomination – our long postponed General Conference will wrestle with theological and connectional matters as we discern our identity as The United Methodist Church even as we mourn the fact that around a quarter of U.S. congregations have already felt compelled to leave. As a denomination and as a nation – we know that regardless of what happens in May and November, some of us will be disappointed. What then are we to celebrate?

In the Psalm above we hear that the LORD God is Sovereign. Furthermore, that having been made in his divine image that we are but a little lower than God and crowned with *his* glory. Conflict is not new to the world – to the church – or even in personal relationships. Neither is God's love and purpose for us new. "⁶For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ... God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." (Ro. 4:6, 8)

Jesus didn't agree with everyone he met. He didn't make any secret about that. He also welcomed everyone into conversation. He ate with sinners and pillars of the community. When the rich young man wondering what he was missing but still wasn't ready to listen, "(Jesus) looked at him and loved him." (Mk. 10:21)

What then are we to celebrate in this new year? The same thing that we always celebrate: a reset – an opportunity to be better. Whatever your personal resolutions may be, I invite you to claim your place as a disciple of Jesus Christ intentionally rejecting the language on enmity and dismissing those with whom you disagree, but instead to look at them and love them – and speaking out (even to our friends) whenever disagreement turns to disdain. Whether or not our preferred policies or candidates or personal goals prevail – we remember that the LORD God is Sovereign. The LORD God is in charge. The LORD God has given us authority and through the blood of Jesus Christ has marked us as harbingers of hope in the world.



But I try to visit 1-2 times a year, and every time I see the church it changes and develops. I tell the congregants that "The church is really named amazing grace."

The Holy Spirit filled my heart with great joy today as the members of the children's choir praised the birth of Jesus. The kid who did the solo part in particular (photo) is the second daughter of Pastor Alfred. She is also a future student of GMSS. I am so touched to see the baby I have been praying for since she was in her mother's womb growing up so beautifully and praising the Lord. Also so precious to see the fern hands lined up to offer. Even God was like, "Oh, these guys are pretty."



It seems like only yesterday that this church gifted desks and chairs for the kids to start kindergarten. Since then it showed that they had built two floors of classrooms to start the elementary school. If you build two more floors in the future, you can register with the Department of Education.

Lord, next time I visit, let me see that both floors of classrooms are built. It's still a Reformation Church, but Amazing Grace UMC leading the vision one by one. I pray that it will be a church that gives back to the Tanzania United Methodist Church.
