A Word From the Pastor

⁸Some Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, saying, ¹⁹ "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that 'if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no child, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. 20 There were seven brothers; the first married and, when he died, left no children; ²¹ and the second married her and died, leaving no children; and the third likewise; ²²none of the seven left children. Last of all the woman herself died. ²³In the resurrection whose wife will she be? For the seven had married her."

²⁴Jesus said to them, "Is not this the reason you are wrong, that you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God? ²⁵For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. ²⁶And as for the dead being raised, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the story about the bush, how God said to him, 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? ²⁷He is God not of the dead, but of the living; you are quite wrong. (Mark 12:8-27) NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Having just realized that a third of the Gospel of Mark is devoted to the events of and Jesus' teaching during Holy Week, I looked at a map of the region surrounding Jerusalem to get a deeper understanding of what transpired. In doing so, my eye was drawn to the Dead Sea.

As you likely know, the Dead Sea is the saltiest body of water on earth: ten times that of the oceans. Due to its high salinity (30%), except for a miniscule number of bacteria, can survive. The unfortunate fish which happen to swim into it from the Jordan River die within minutes. Why is it that the Dead Sea is devoid of life while the freshwater Sea of Galilee, fed by the same Jordan River, teems with life?

The difference lies in the fact that Jordan River doesn't just fill the Sea of Galilee but flows out of it as well, whereas, instead of continuing on into the ocean, when it gets to the Dead Sea it stops.

Scripture tells us that Jesus was baptized in that life giving Jordan River just a few miles upstream from the Dead Sea, and that his disciples derived their livelihood from the Sea of Galilee: places where the water flowed.

In Holy Week, we anticipate the climax of Christian hope – the promise of new life in Jesus' resurrection. In our own baptism and profession of faith we claim that life. Yet we merely have to look at the Dead Sea to understand what happens to that life if it stops there. Not only do we lose out, but we risk becoming toxic to others. We have a constant need for renewal that we find each week when we gather on Sunday morning for a "little Easter" and during the week when we live as the agents of grace that we've become by refusing to be satisfied with our own hope alone.

In that last week of his life before being crucified for our sake, Jesus walked back and forth from Bethany and Jerusalem spending time with his friends and disciples, but also teaching about what his resurrection means for us. Of his Father he says, "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living." (Mk 12:27a) On that road between Jerusalem and Bethany, Jesus passed a fig tree that bore no fruit and cursed it. The next morning, as they passed again, his disciples noticed that it had withered and died. Rather than using it as the obvious example of what befalls those who fail to produce fruit, Jesus promised them that if they had faith and acted on it — even commanding a mountain to be tossed into the sea — that it would be done. (Mk 11:12-14, 20-24)

If there are places where you've dammed up your faith – if you're feeling dried up and thirsty even though you feel like you should have it together – may this month be filled with a new sense of hope in eternal life and anticipation for what God can do through you.

Scout Sunday




