A Word From the Pastor

⁸Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. 9For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; ¹⁰but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. ¹¹When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I

became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. ¹²For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. ¹³And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

(1 Corinthians 13:8-13 NRSV)

Grace and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Have you heard? There's an eclipse coming. It seems like that should be a routine event. We have a new moon every $29^{1/2}$ days when the moon's orbit places it between the sun and Earth. Because of that, shouldn't we have at least twelve eclipses. But, we don't. I recently counted the number of total eclipses over the United States going back to 1918. In that time, there have been fifteen total eclipses. Five of them seen only in Alaska or Hawaii. The 2017 eclipse was the only one (so far) to pass through Illinois. After the upcoming eclipse on April 8, there will not be another total eclipse in the United States until 2045. For Illinois, it will be September 14, 2099!

Annular eclipse (when the moon's orbit passes in line with the sun but at a distance when it doesn't block out the sun) happen about as often, but they're more difficult to notice.


Why is your pastor taking so much time to talk about eclipses? Because another one is coming soon, and I'm chasing it. I've made reservations and paid a deposit for a campsite about midway in the path of totality, so that depending on weather forecasts I can get up early and go to where clouds are less likely. Ten years ago, I would have thought doing so was a bit silly or extreme. But after driving witnessing the August 21, 2017 total eclipse in person, I want to see it again.

Until seeing it in person, I thought that I knew what to expect. I'd seen the photos and videos. I'd read the descriptions. To paraphrase St. Paul, that is but: To see in a mirror, dimly. To know only in part. I still get goosebumps when I try to describe what I witnessed that day seven years ago.

When others roll their eyes at my excitement, I feel a sort of pity for what they've missed, rather than embarrassment for my boldness. I hear that same excitement when others share their description of what we insiders know is indescribable outside of the experience.



Our faith is like that. Isn't it? It's difficult – if not impossible - to adequately describe to those who've never seen it for themselves. In the hymn *Pass It On*, the final verse begins, "I wish for you my friend / this happiness that I've found" and goes on to say, "I'll shout it from the mountain top / I want my world to know." How do we pass it on? Will it make any difference to shout it, if our description seem so inadequate?

The best part of "Show and Tell" in grammar school wasn't the *telling*; it was the *showing*. The telling serving to bring understanding to what was shown.

Even though a passing cloud might obscure an eclipse, that doesn't mean it didn't happen. Unlike eclipses and other celestial events, God's love endures so that, even the darkest cloud can cast but a shadow for that moment it lingers, only to be overwhelmed by light.

Paul says again, "For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light." (Eph. 5:8) Light has to be seen. Will others see faith in you? Will you stay alert for each moment of God's love to shine on you, and to shine through you, and to allow your joy to shine through?

I don't know if I'll be around twenty-one years from now for the next eclipse. So, I'm going to pursue my opportunity to see this one, just like I'm going to strive to notice and to bask in the light of God's love even on the cloudiest day so that other might find encouragement to look for themselves and know that same joy.






We do not accept electronics, clothing, or shoes. We will have more information in next month's *Messenger*.

DAR ES SALAAM, TANZANIA – God has a way of working through challenges even when we are tempted to give up. The Global Mission Secondary School (GMSS) had been years in the planning. In 2020, God miraculously made a way to complete phase one, which included four classrooms, three laboratories, an administration block, a well, kitchen, public toilets, dorms, fence and playground. Our teaching team gathered, and God sent 41 students who came from lower income families or single parent households. I greatly appreciate all the donors who made it possible to enroll 41 students with scholarships that covered 50% of the school fees.

In 2022 and 2023, we completed phases two and three, which included a library, cafeteria, small dispensary, prayer tower, additional dormitories and an office building. The Cornerstone Church on campus was completed with support from First Korean United Methodist Church in Wheeling, Illinois.

The Rev. Sun Hyung Jo and two church members from First Korean UMC came to Tanzania to officiate at the Cornerstone Church dedication in September 2023, with the GMSS community, the Dar es Salaam district superintendent, church leaders and members of United Methodist churches in Tanzania.

Today, the GMSS community has grown to 148 students, nine full-time and two part-time teachers, two administrative staff, three security personnel and three cooks. It is located on the western outskirts of Dar es Salaam city. Through our parents, who volunteered to be GMSS ambassadors, the school has become widely known in Tanzania. When we were recruiting new students for the 2024 academic year, 182 candidates took the entrance exams, even though we had capacity for only 40 students. This is the work of the Holy Spirit, who has been helping us *build a Christian school where lives are transformed, and global leaders are raised* (the school vision).

I extend my heartfelt appreciation to each donor, scholarshipgiver and mission partner who is committed to supporting and praying for the next generations and my work as a missionary. God's work cannot be done alone; together, we can accomplish more for Christ and the Kingdom. May your life be a blessing to others in need and promote peace and justice in all that you do.

The Rev. Young Seon "Christina" Kim is a United Methodist missionary with Global Ministries who works as the director of Next Generation Ministries of the United Methodist church in Tanzania, based in Dar es Salaam. Next Generation recruits and equips young leadership for ministry and mission.

Many of you at church have followed Pastor Kim's journey in Tanzania. The above is a summary of her accomplishments in founding, building and now directing the Global Missions Secondary School. The full article also includes information about the Nifuate Center and two baptisms. (see GBGM website)

It is an understatement to say that her accomplishments in Tanzania are extraordinary. With God's help she has built an upper level Christian school that is now well known and respected in Tanzania.
