A Word From the Pastor

³¹What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

In her hymn, *His Eye Is on the Sparrow*, Civilla Martin writes: "Why should I feel discouraged? / Why should the shadows come? / Why should my heart be lonely and long for heaven and home, / When Jesus is my portion? / My constant friend is he." This is a challenging time for the church. We face the challenge of a changing culture around us, in which the notion of religion is often devalued. We face challenges within and between denominations that occupy too much of our conversation and energy rather than proclaiming salvation in Jesus Christ. Likewise, the covid shut-downs and social distancing that limited our time together, became a habit for some.


As a congregation, we are faced with the challenge of how to do ministry with the resources that we have, but also to consider what might be. Every church I've served has had a "summer dip" in giving. We tend to give when we're present. That summer dip has been compounded this year by unexpected expenses from the flooding in the parsonage basement and an earlier furnace repair that depleted reserve funds. So, "what then are we to say about these things?" Will they stop us from ministry?

Look! Vacation Bible School ministered to nineteen children! The church is filled with scouts three nights a week! Those afflicted by addiction to gambling have a place to gather for healing! The Bible is studied with lay leadership! The Gospel is preached and our hope given voice in worship!

Recently, three of us attended a learning session on utilizing church resources to grow our financial health, others will be gathering soon for a professional consultation as we discern how best to serve our community, and still others will be planning for a stewardship program for our congregation this year.

In the meantime, for the sake of cash flow, we've had to utilize designated funds to meet routine expenses. That is a weighty burden for our church leaders. I ask you to pray for the church leaders for discernment but also for assurance in their work.

But I also ask that you encourage their leadership. One way will be to receive their stewardship efforts as opportunity. Another is to consider how God is inviting you to put forth yourself as a resource for the work of the church as we strive together to be a voice of hope, compassion, and life in this community; for that you'll find a "survey" of service opportunities. (Page 9 of this publication.) I ask that you would take the time to reflect on those things – even the things that seem "inconsequential" but which help us to be a place for mission and ministry – and print it and put in the offering plate or e-mail me or the church office so that we can get you set up to shine.

The chorus of that hymn above ends, "I sing because I'm happy / I sing because I'm free /for his eye is on the sparrow / and I know he watches me." Be happy. Be free. Trust that in all things we offer to the Lord, God will transform into blessing.


