

## A Word From the Pastor

He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?

(Micah 6:8 NRSV)



Since those early days when my dad sat us down in front of the TV to watch Saturn rocket moon launches, I've been fascinated with space flight. I watch each new Starship launch watching for and anticipating a successful landing. Because of the timing I didn't get to watch the recent Blue Origin flight that has stirred up so much controversy.

For those unfamiliar, on April 14, Blue Origin (the company owned by Amazon.com founder, Jeff Bezos) launched what was billed as the first all female space flight crew Even though cosmonaut, Valentina Tereshkova, piloted a solo mission including 48 orbits 1963.]

Personally, I wasn't that interested because it seemed like a vanity project for rich celebrities (including Bezo's fiancé) who were really passengers more than a crew. I'm troubled by the vitriol that has accompanied news reports about the endeavor.

Why are we surprised that a pop star took the opportunity to sing, "What a Wonderful World"? Yes, it's a bit hokey. But so what? Katy Perry has had a couple of catchy songs and she was fortunate to get invited for a trip that most of us will never be able to afford. Fault finders have to find faults. Didn't she once say something about needed to address problems on earth and the environment? The complaints go on. Why should someone be derided for enjoying a moment, that many of us would relish ourselves?


I don't know that it's a new phenomena (I've only been alive for 58 years), and maybe it's because of how easy it is to spread news compared to the past; but I notice that it seems as if the one unifying feature of our culture is to look for flaws in others – especially if they've ever disagreed with us on any (even insignificant) issue – or if their perspective has evolved over time.

Yet, what does the Lord require of us, but to do justice (i.e. be fair), to love kindness (show mercy), and to walk humbly before the Lord our God. Cancel culture – whether it be refusing to watch a Jane Fonda movie, or vandalizing Tesla vehicles, or condemning public figures for decades past (often youthful and foolish) indiscretions – undermines our ability to grow as people and as Christians.

Jesus ate with sinners and tax collectors; but he also ate with Pharisees and prominent people with whom he disagreed. He calls us to do the same – to engage with anybody and everybody in a spirit of charity and goodwill. That doesn't mean that we have to put our values aside or to affirm evil when it presents itself. At that same time, we are called to humbly accept that disagreement does equal evil, and that if God is willing to look beyond our flaws that we should do the same with others.

As Christians, let's reach for the stars: to be a voice of mercy for those with whom we disagree (even in the midst of those who agree with us), to humbly celebrate even our rival's success, and to speak for justice as fairness for others rather than reprisal for those things that have hurt us.

It's not easy – because there will always be voices seeking to dismiss that message and disparage us for speaking it. But I'm convinced there are souls longing to hear it – if only we will say it. God made a wonderful world. Let's draw attention to that wonder.


#### PEANUT BUTTER ENDOWMENT






